## **Celebrate Poetry with a Haiku**

April celebrates National Poetry Month and April 17 is National Haiku Day. Haiku, also known as hokku, is a poetry form from Japan. During the Heian period (700-1100), there was a social requirement to appreciate and recite poetry; therefore, making short forms of poetry popular. Originally, a haiku was divided into 17 mora (Japanese unit of syllable weight) in a single line. Because there is no equal of mora in the English language, three lines of 5 syllables -7 syllables - 5 syllables make up the haiku format we know today. A syllable represents the unit(s) that make up a word, containing a vowel sound and usually one or more consonants. Get poetic and write your own haiku today. We would love to read them!


